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FEEDBACK ANALYSIS

STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY (2021-22)

In order to conduct a student satisfaction survey for the session 2021-22, an elaborate questionnaire was prepared through Google Forms and was disseminated among Undergraduate and Postgraduate students of the college from each discipline. The feedback form constitutes open-ended and close-ended questions from four major areas viz. **Academics and Curricula, Evaluation and Assessment, College's student assistance system and Infrastructural Facilities of the college**. The questionnaire consists of 50 structured questions. As per the responses, the data analysis was conducted. Among the sample respondents, 23.70 percent were male students and 76.30 percent were female students, 39 percent of students belonged to Faculty of Arts, 55.90 percent of students belonged to Faculty of Science and 5.10 percent of the students belonged to Faculty of Commerce The results of the data analysis on the responses of the students are as presented below.

Respondents' Details

A. Gender of the Respondent:

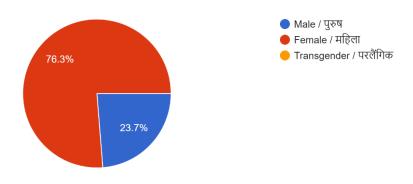


Figure 1: Gender-wise classification of student respondents

The Figure 1 represents the classification of student respondents based on gender. As is depicted in the figure, 23.70 percent of the student respondents were male, whereas 76.30 percent of student respondent were females.

B. Faculty of the Respondents:




Figure 2: Faculty-wise classification of student respondents




Figure 3: Academics and Curricula

The section I of the questionnaire was prepared to gauge the satisfaction level of students regarding **Academics and Curricula** and consisted of 15 questions. The results of data analysis are depicted in Table A and Figure 3. The results show that 91.50 percent of the student find the course material well-structured, thorough, current, and organized. However, 8.50 percent of the students disagree with the same. Approximately 98.30 percent of the students agree that syllabus's material is covered in class, but 1.70 percent of students think otherwise.

Regarding use of ICT and instructional tools in the classrooms by the teachers, 74.60 percent of the students agree that teachers use ICT and instructional tools in the classrooms to assist teaching, whereas 25.40 percent of students disagree to the same. Around 84.70 percent of students agree that the curriculum of the college has a positive impact on teamwork, whereas 15.30 percent disagree to the same. Approximately 91 percent of the students agree that the curriculum represent the most recent trends and best practices in the relevant fields and it is applicable to real-world situations, however, 8.80 percent of the students do not consider it to be true. Amongst the sample respondents, 97 percent of the students are of the view that the faculty arrive in the class ready and prepared to teach the class. Around 86 percent of the students agree that the professors offer examples of how to apply the material out of the textbook, whereas, 13.60 percent of the students think that the professors need to improve on this front.

Approximately 93 percent of the students agree that the professors provide a current list of books, journals, periodicals etc. that students can use as reference material. Similarly, 96.60 percent of students believe that the method of instruction used by the teachers is interactive and encouraging. Approximately 88 percent of the students agree that the various teaching and learning techniques, such as case studies, group discussions, and classes are employed to attain the desired learning outcome. However, 11.90 percent of the students disagree to this. Amongst the respondent students, 94.90 percent agree that teachers provide advice on how to write research papers, assignments, etc., whereas, 5.10 percent of the students disagree to the same. Approximately 92 percent of the students find that there is a balance between theory and practice in the classroom, whereas, 8.50 percent are unable to feel the same. The results show that 86.40 percent of the students agree that creative thinking, critical thinking, and problemsolving skills are stimulated by the teachers in the classroom. Approximately 98 percent of the students have developed leadership, time-management, and communication skills, whereas, 1.70 percent of the students believe that there is a need for improvement on this front. Amongst the respondent students, 96.60 percent were able to develop entrepreneurial and work skills during the study process of the college, however, 3.40 percent did not have the same benefit.




Figure 4: Evaluation and Assessment

The section II of the questionnaire was prepared to gauge the satisfaction level of students regarding **Evaluation and Assessment** procedure of the college and consisted of 5 questions. The results of data analysis are depicted in Table B and Figure 4.

The results of the analysis of the responses shows that majority of the student respondents (93.20 percent) are of the view that students are clearly informed of the frequency, procedure, and assessment criteria, including the grading standards, prior to the start of the exam, whereas 6.80 percent of the students state that they are not provided with such information by the college. Amongst the student respondents, 89.80 percent are of the view that the assignments or projects assigned to them by the teachers are pertinent and aid in enhancing comprehension and application of the subject matter, however, 10.20 percent of the students disagree to the same. Approximately 98 percent of the students are satisfied and agree to the fact that before moving on to the next assessment, the teachers provide honest and prompt feedback on each previous assessment, however, 1.70 percent of the students disagree to this. Around 78 percent of the students agree that the internal evaluation process of the college is unbiased and nondiscriminatory, however, 22 percent of the students are of the view that the internal evaluation system of the college is biased and discriminatory, which should be eliminated with immediate effect. Majority of the students (93.20 percent) find the that the exams in the college are conducted in a fair, orderly, and disciplined way, however, 6.80 percent of the students don't agree with the same.




Figure 5 (a): Student Assistance




Figure 5(b): Student Assistance

III. Student Assistance

The section III of the questionnaire was prepared to gauge the satisfaction level of students regarding **Student Assistance** provided by the college and consisted of 15 questions. The results of data analysis are depicted in Table C (a), Table C (b), Figure 5 (a) and Figure 5 (b).

As suggested by the results of the analysis conducted on the student responses, majority of the students (88.10 percent) agree that there exists in a college a plan to offer counselling and guidance to help students get better grades, however, 11.90 percent of the students did not experience this in the college. Around 90 percent of the students are of the view that professors can recognize the limitations of the students, assist them in overcoming the same and weaker pupils are given extra attention. However, 10.20 percent of the students have experienced that professors are unable to recognize the limitations of the students, they do not assist them in overcoming them and no extra attention is given to students who are weaker in studies. Approximately 97 percent of the students agree that co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are encouraged for pupils to participate in, whereas 3.40 percent of the students disagree to the same. Amongst the students, 93.20 percent are of the view that students are encouraged to take part in volunteer work in the community. Majority of the students (88.10 percent) know that NSS programs are organized and run by the college, but 11.90 percent of the students are still unaware of the same. Around 66 percent of the students are aware of the college's grievance redressal cell and 33.90 percent of the students are still unaware about it and should be made aware at the earliest.

Majority of the students (84.70 percent) are satisfied from the knowledge they gained form the orientation program organized by the college and agree that it was useful for them. Approximately 88 percent of the students agree that the college actively promotes possibilities for students to participate in internships and field trips, but 11.90 percent of the students believe that that the college does not engage in such activities. Around 88 percent of the students are of the view that the professors make an attempt to instill employability skills, life skills, and soft skills to prepare the students for the workplace, but 11.90 percent of the students disagree to the same. Majority of the students (93.20 percent) have experienced that they always receive their marksheets on time, but 6.80 percent of the students differ in their experience on the matter. Approximately 68 percent of the students are aware about IQAC and NAAC, but there is a need to educate the remaining 32 percent of the students about IQAC and NAAC.

Approximately 32 percent if the students of the college had an excellent experience of the college's admission procedure, 54.20. percent of the students had good experience and 8.50 percent of the students had an average experience of the admission process of the college, whereas none of the students had a bad experience regarding the same. Approximately 20 percent of the students had an excellent experience regarding college administrative staff,

around 70 percent of the students had a good experience, 8.50 percent had an average experience and none of the students had a bad experience regarding the same. Approximately 15 percent of the students had an excellent experience regarding the placement cell of the college, around 63 percent had good experience and 8.50 percent had average experience of the same. Moreover, 3.40 percent of the students had a bad experience regarding placement cell of the college.

IV. Infrastructural Facilities




Figure 6 (a): Infrastructural Facilities

The section IV of the questionnaire was prepared to gauge the satisfaction level of students regarding **Infrastructural Facilities** provided by the college and consisted of 13 questions. The results of data analysis are depicted in Table D (a), Table D (b), Figure 6 (a) and Figure 6 (b).

The results of the analysis of the student responses reveals that 79.70 percent of the students are satisfied with the computer laboratories, classroom facilities, projectors, appropriate seating, etc. in the college, however, 20.30 percent of the students are dissatisfied with it and believe that the facilities need updating and improvement. Sixty-two percent (62.70 %) of the students agree that computer lab facilities are available to them when needed but 37.30 percent of the students are of the view that such facilities are not readily available to them. Around 73 percent of the students are of the view that they have ready access to internet facilities in the

college for academic purposes, however, 27.10 percent of the students are not satisfied with such facilities. Around fifty-seven percent (57.60 %) of the students agree that library and eresources facilities are available to them when needed but 42.40 percent of the students are of the view that such facilities are not readily available to them. Majority of the students (61 percent) are not aware about the facility of digital library that is available around the clock, and there is a need to spread awareness amongst them. However, 39 percent of the students are aware that the facility of digital library is available in the college for them to use round-the-clock. Around 71 percent of the students agree that the library's schedule is appropriate, but 28.80 percent of the students disagree to the same.

Majority of the students (71.20 percent) find college's common areas like bathrooms and classrooms clean and properly maintained, but 28.80 percent of the students disagree with the same. Amongst the respondent students, 93.20 percent agree that there are sufficient indoor and outdoor sporting and leisure facilities available in the college. Approximately 90 percent of the students find the college's website to be informative and 10.20 percent disagree to the same. Around 95 of the respondent students agree that they have been informed of the COVID-19 process that must be followed on campus by the college administration.

Around sixteen percent (16.90 %) of the students disclose that they have had an excellent experience with the quality of food provided in the canteen of the college, 28.80 percent of the students had a good experience, 6.80 percent of the students had an average experience regarding canteen facilities of the college, whereas, 5.10 percent had a bad experience for the same.




Figure 6 (b): Infrastructural Facilities

Around 45.80 percent of the students disclose that they have had an excellent experience with the drinking water facility of the college, 45.80 percent of the students had a good experience, 1.70 percent of the students had an average experience, whereas 3.40 of the students had a bad experience regarding the same. Approximately 19 percent of the students agree that they have had an excellent experience with the library reading room facility of the college, 50.80 percent of the students have had a good experience, and 1.70 percent of the students have had an average experience and 6.80 percent of the students had a bad experience regarding reading room facility of the college.
